

**RESOLUTION NO. 07-02**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE SAN GABRIEL VALLEY COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS (“SGVCOG”) A RESOLUTION OF SAN GABRIEL VALLEY COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS SUPPORTING THE PLUG-IN HYBRID ELECTRIC VEHICLE CAMPAIGN**

The San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments, California (hereafter referred to as the “SGVCOG”) does resolve as follows:

**WHEREAS**, the over-reliance of America on foreign oil is a serious and growing threat to the economic vitality and national security interest of the United States; and

**WHEREAS**, automobile emissions are a major contributing factor to global warming and to smog in our cities, which threaten the health of our citizens and the sustainability of our planet; and

**WHEREAS**, the imbalance between gasoline resources and worldwide demand is escalating gasoline prices at an alarming rate and to levels that overburden commerce, hurt economic growth and cause serious hardship on our citizens; and

**WHEREAS**, the technology exists today to build a flexible-fuel plug-in hybrid electric automobile that could reduce oil imports, fuel costs to our citizens and air emissions by dramatic margins; and

**WHEREAS**, the SGVCOG is partnering with the City of Austin, Texas, and over 25 other U.S. cities and agencies to urge automakers to mass produce plug-in hybrid vehicles for the substantial economical, environmental and strategic reasons outlined.

**NOW, THEREFORE, THE SGVCOG GOVERNING BOARD DOES RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:**

**SECTION 1.** That the SGVCOG strongly supports the effort to create a viable market for plug-in hybrid electric vehicles (PHEVs).

**SECTION 2.** That the SGVCOG makes a commitment to support local, state and federal policies that will promote flexible-fuel plug-in hybrid vehicles.

**SECTION 3.** That the SGVCOG will work with other local governments, education, business and environmental communities to advocate for the purchase of flexible-fuel plug-in hybrid vehicles.
